The members of the community enter and pray in silence. After the community is fully assembled, the prelude should be presented.

Prelude

“The Burial of Saint Brendan”

by Padraig Colum

Nearing death, Brendan knew his body would offer both spiritual and material gifts that some people would try to appropriate for their own benefit. In Padraic Colum’s “The Burial of Saint Brendan,” the saint seeks to ensure that — even in death — he will be able to glorify God for the good of all rather than profit the selfish few.

A period of silent meditation follows the reading before the leader begins the penitential prayers.

Penitential Prayers

A bell rings and the members of the community kneel. If anyone cannot kneel, they should remain seated with their head bowed.

We bend our knees

(making the sign of the cross)

in the eye of the Father who created us,

in the eye of the Son who purchased us,

in the eye of the Spirit who cleansed us. Amen.

All stand.

Leader	Holy God, Father, Son and Spirit, help us to love and bless your creation, all that we see, all that we hear, all that we touch. Let us share your peace with our fellow creatures at all times, living as signs of forgiveness and reconciliation on the earth ...
All	... as the angels and saints do in heaven: without malice, without jealousy, without envy, without fear, without terror of anyone under the sun. And may the Father, the Son and the Spirit kindle in our hearts the flame of love to our neighbors, to our foes, to our friends, to our kindred all, to the brave, to the knave, to the thrall.
Leader	The peace of the Father of Joy, the peace of Christ the Lamb, the peace of the Spirit of Grace, be with you.
Community	The peace of the Father of Joy, of Christ the Lamb, and of the Spirit of Grace, be with us all.
Leader	Let us share a sign of peace with those present here as a testimony to the peace God offers to the world.

The members of the community share a sign of peace before sitting down. A brief period of silence follows before the reader begins the Word of God.

The Word of God

Reader I set the teachings of Christ before you;
I set the guarding of God about you.

Community **May it possess us and protect us all.**

Reader A reading from the Gospel according to Saint John.

Jesus said:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

The gospel of Jesus Christ, source of strength,
Source of salvation, source of healing grace.

Community **May it be a mantle to our bodies.**

A brief silence follows the reading, until the leader begins the psalm.

Leader Psalm 62, Verses 1 through 12.

For God alone my soul waits in silence;

	from him comes my salvation.
Community	He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall never be shaken.
Leader	How long will you assail a person,
Community	will you batter your victim, all of you, as you would a leaning wall, a tottering fence?
Leader	Their only plan is to bring down a person of prominence. They take pleasure in falsehood;
Community	they bless with their mouths, but inwardly they curse.
Leader	For God alone my soul waits in silence,
Community	for my hope is from him.
Leader	He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.
Community	On God rests my deliverance and my honor; my mighty rock, my refuge is in God.
Leader	Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him;
Community	God is a refuge for us.
Leader	Those of low estate are but a breath, those of high estate are a delusion;
Community	in the balances they go up; they are together lighter than a breath.
Leader	Put no confidence in extortion, and set no vain hopes on robbery;
Community	if riches increase, do not set your heart on them.
Leader	Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God,
Community	and steadfast love belongs to you, O Lord. For you repay to all according to their work.

The leader should invite the community to share reflections on their experiences during this sequence of prayer services by saying:

Leader	At the end of any journey, especially a spiritual one, it is important to consider where you have been, what you have done and who you
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have met during your travels. So, take a moment to reflect on your time traveling with Brendan and his companions.

Then, if you have any thoughts or prayers you would like to share, perhaps an image or a particular moment from your prayers, please share them now as remembrances or prayerful desires for your companions. Please remember to be brief so everyone who desires will have an opportunity to speak.

The members of the community share brief reflections or prayers from their experiences during the retreat. When appropriate, the leader ends these reflections by saying:

Leader Let us reflect and pray in silence.

A period of silence is observed for private meditation, with or without music. Afterward, the leader proceeds to the Eucharistic Prayer after the optional hymn.

Hymn (optional)

Eucharistic Prayer

If the community wishes to share the Eucharist, the table is prepared during the hymn. If there is no hymn, the table should be prepared in silence — slowly and deliberately. Then, the leader begins the Eucharistic Prayer.

Leader Thanks be to you, Holy Father of Glory,
father-kind, ever-loving, ever-powerful,
because of all the abundance,
favor and deliverance that you bestow on us in our need.

Community **May your name be praised forever,
in the heavens above and here on earth.**

Leader Whatever Providence befalls us as your children,
in our portion, in our lot, in our path,
give to us with it the riches of your hand
and the joyous blessing of your mouth.

Community **May your kingdom be seen to flourish
through the joy of your people, always grateful.**

Leader In the steep common path of our calling,
be it easy or uneasy to our flesh,

be it bright or dark for us to follow,
your perfect guidance will be upon us.

Community

**Provide for us in all our needs,
material and spiritual, this day and every day.**

Leader

Be a shield to us from the wiles of the deceiver,
from the arch-destroyer with his arrows pursuing us,
and in each secret thought our minds get to weave,
guide and protect us.

Community

**Do not allow us to be tossed about by temptations
and protect us from all evils that would do us harm.**

Leader

O Loving Christ, who was hanged upon a tree,
each day and each night we remember your covenant;
in our lying down and rising up, we yield ourselves to your cross,
in our lives and our deaths, we seek in you our peace.
Each day, may we remember the source of the mercies
you bestowed on us, gently and generously;
each day, may we become fuller in love with you.

My brothers and sisters, with St. Paul, I say to you:
"I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord
Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and
when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that
is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way he took
the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in
my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'
For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the
Lord's death until he comes." (1 Corinthians 11: 23-26)

O Gracious God, (making the sign of the cross)
may your Spirit come upon us, and upon this bread and wine,
so that it might illumine our understanding, kindle our will,
incite our love, strengthen our weakness, and enfold our desires.

**O Generous Lord,
cleanse our hearts, make holy our souls, confirm our faith,
keep safe our minds, encompass our bodies about
so that in our own hearts, we may feel your presence.**

Leader

O Holy Spirit, of greatest power,
come down upon us and subdue us;
from your glorious mansion in the heavens.
The knee that is stiff, O healer, make pliant,
the heart that is cold, make warm beneath your wing;

guide the soul that is wandering from your path
and it shall not die.
Each thing that is foul, may you cleanse,
each thing that is hard, may you soften with your grace,
each wound that is causing us pain, may you make whole.
Now to the Father who created each creature,
now to the Son who paid ransom for his people,
now to the Holy Spirit, comforter of might:
shield and protect us from every wound.

Community **Encompass the beginning and the end of our race,
give us courage to sing in glory,
in peace, in rest, in reconciliation.**

Leader Come share in the table of the Lord,
source of love for those who cherish his kindness,
source of solace for those who need his forgiveness,
source of hope for those who fear his judgement.
Come share in the table of the Lord.

Community **Where no tear shall be shed,
where death comes no more. Amen.**

The community shares the Eucharist in silence. Afterward, the table is cleared during the hymn. If there is no hymn, the members of the community use this time for private prayer.

Hymn (optional)

Then, the leader continues the service.

Prayers and Blessings

Leader Praise to the Father,
praise to the Son,
praise to the Spirit.

Community **The three in one.**

All stand.

Leader Let us pray for the coming of the Kingdom,
in the words our Lord taught us:

All **“Our Father in heaven,**

hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come.

as we also have forgiven our debtors.

safeguarding us in the sanctuary of your love ...

our thoughts, our deeds, our words, our will,
our understanding and our intellect.

Everything we are sings your praises.

We give you worship with our whole lives.

If you wish us to join in your prayers for these needs,
speak them aloud, saying when you are finished,
"For this I pray."

Members of the community offer their particular prayers. The community's response to these individual petitions is:

***May God's blessing be yours,
and well may it befall you.***

When these personal prayers are finished, the leader offers the final blessing.

May the Father, Son and Spirit enfold you on every side,
never forsaking or forgetting you,
nor letting evil come near you,
in each step of the journey before you.
God the Father go with you at every pass,
Christ our Lord be with you on every hill,
The Spirit of Grace guide you across every stream.
May the Triune God protect and keep you
from every challenge and sorrow,
from every evil and anguish ...

Hymn (optional)

The members of the community sit or kneel after the service concludes, as they prefer. Silence is observed to allow private prayer or meditation. Individuals should leave quietly as the Spirit moves them.
